

General description, T. 37 N., R. 38 E.

This township lies in the valley of the Humboldt and the Little Humboldt Rivers. The Humboldt river just enters the township in sec. 34. The land is swampy along its course, and sec. 36 is nearly all tule swamp and subject to overflow from the river. The Little Humboldt river enters the township in sec. 1, and flows in a southwesterly and southern course across the entire township, and joins the Humboldt in sec. 34. The Little Humboldt is dry the greater part of the year.

The land in the western part of the township is rolling and slopes gently toward the east, this portion is covered with heavy sage-brush and the soil is of good quality. The central part of the township lies along the Little Humboldt river and the land is alkaline and salty, and of little value. The north third of the township is drifting sand hills and of no value. The stage road between Winnemucca and Paradise Valley crosses the township from southwest to northeast and there is a station or road house, known as "Toll House" in sec. 2.
