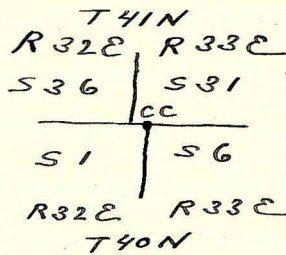
40.00 The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

I destroy all traces of this corner and its accessories and re-establish it at the same point as follows:

Set a basalt stone $24 \times 20 \times 12$ ins.
16 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on the W. face, and dig pits
 $18 \times 18 \times 12$ ins. N. and S. of stone 3 ft.
dist. and raise a mound of earth $3\frac{1}{2}$
ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high W. of cor.

56.90 Intersect the 8th Standard Parallel
North at $S 89^\circ E$, 10.75 chs. from the
Standard cor. of T. 41 N, R. 32 and 33 E
re-established by me Sept. 1, 1912.

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam.
24 ins. in the ground for closing corner
of T 40 N, R. 32 and 33 E, with brass
cap mkd.
