

Subdivision of T 40 N R 32 E.

Chains.

44.50

Rocky mountain spur, slopes S. E.

58.54

Intersect the 8th. Standard Parallel North at $589^{\circ}E$, 10.85 chs from the standard cor. of secs. 35 and 36; re-established by me Sept. 1, 1912

On N.W. slope

Set a volcanic stone $17 \times 7 \times 7$ ins.

12 ins. in the ground for closing corner of secs. 1 and 2, marked CC on S. face, with 1 groove on E. and 5 grooves on W. face and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high S. of cor.

Land, rough volcanic mountains.

Soil, rocky, wholly unfit for cultivation, 4th. rate.

Good growth sage brush, little grass, no timber.

On the N. bdy. of sec. 1, at a point midway between the closing corner of T 40 N, R. 32 and 33 E; and the closing corner of secs. 1 and 2; set a volcanic stone $24 \times 10 \times 6$ ins., 16 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. N. of sec. 1, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on the S. face, and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high S. of cor.

At the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35, on the S. bdy. of the T.P., established by me Sept. 4 1912, at 8 h. a.m., f.m.t., I set off $41^{\circ}17'N$ on the lat. arc, $4^{\circ}56'N$ on the decl. arc, and determine a true meridian with the solar.
