

Subdivision of T 40 N R 32 E

Chains.

45.00 Road, bears E. and W.

49.20 West branch of Hoppy creek, 4 lks. wide flows easterly.

50.40 Leave pasture, enter alfalfa field
Wire fence bears, E. and W.

59.46 Cross fence between alfalfa fields, bears E. and W.

62.67 In alfalfa field,
Intersect the 8th Standard Parallel North at $S 89^{\circ} E$, 10.75 chs. from the Standard corner of secs. 32 and 33, re-established by me Sept. 1, 1912

Set a basalt stone $24 \times 8 \times 7$ ins., 16 ins. in the ground for closing corner of secs. 4 and 5, marked C C on S. with 4 grooves on E. and 2 grooves on W. face and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high S. of cor.

Land: mountainous, and rolling pasture, and cultivated fields

Soil: rocky, and good rich loam, several feet in depth. 4th. and 1st. rate.

S. 38.00 chs. is mountainous, unfit for cultivation.

N. 24.67 chs. is rolling and level land, good fertile soil, 1st. rate.

On uncultivated land is good growth sagebrush, little grass, no timber
Easterly and N. E. slope.

From the closing corner of secs. 4 and 5.

The N.E. cor. of De Lang's squatter, house bears $S 15^{\circ} E$, 8.20 chs. dist.

The N.E. cor. of his stable bears $S 18^{\circ} E$, 13.20 chs. dist.

The N.E. cor. of a small cement block house bears $S 23^{\circ} 15' E$, 16.00 chs. dist.

On the N. bdy of sec. 4, at a point midway between the closing corners of sec. 3 and 4, and 4 and 5, Set a basalt
