 38.40 Mountain spur, slopes S.W.
 40.00 On steep S.W. slope
 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam.
 2 1/4 ins. in the ground for 1/4 sec. cor.
 with brass cap wk'd

 N. 29.96 chs. from the cor. of secs.

 as described by the Surveyor General.
 Set a gray andsite stone 16 x 11 x 9 ins.,

 E. face and raise a mound of stone 2 ft.
 base, 1 1/2 ft. high E. of cor.
