70.58 Intersect the W. bdy. of the tp. at N.
29.95 chs. from the cor. of secs. 13, 18,
19 and 24; which corner is an iron
post, firmly set in the ground, of the
dimensions, and marked and witnessed
as described by the Surveyor General.
On S. slope of white hill.

Set a volcanic stone 14x10x6 ins., 10 ins.
in the ground for closing corner of
secs. 18 and 19, marked CC on E. face,
with 3 grooves on N. and S. faces, and
raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base
1½ ft. high E. of cor.

Land, rough volcanic mountains.

Soil, rocky, unfit for cultivation. 4th. rate.
Good growth sagebrush, little grass, a
few clumps of quaking aspen and
willows in the ravines.

General westerly and south westerly slope.

On the W. bdy of sec. 19, at a point midway
between the closing corners of secs.
19 and 30; and 18 and 19; Set a volcanic
stone 21x14x4 ins., 14 ins. in the
ground for ¼ sec. cor. W. of sec. 19,
marked ¼ on the E. face, and raise
a mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1½ ft.
high E. of cor.

N. 0.4° W bet. secs. 19 and 18

Along W. slope of mountain divide.

19.40 Rocky mountain spur, slopes W, is divide
between Hopper creek and Jackson creek,
disced steep, rocky N.W. slope.
