

Resurvey of the N. bdy. T 34 N, R 38 E

Chains

- N 89° 40' E bet. secs. 2 and 35, continuing my blank line
- 40.00 I search diligently but find no $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
- 78.52 Intersect the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36
A willow stake 2 ins. diam. by 15 ins. above ground, firmly set in the ground, in a mound of earth and stone, and marked with 5 notches on the W. and 1 notch on the E. side
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- N 89° 40' E bet. secs. 1 and 36, continuing my blank line.
- 40.00 I search diligently, finding no $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
- 74.24 Intersect the cor. of T. 45 N, R. 38 and 39 E.
A basalt stone 12 x 11 ins. by 8 ins. above ground, marked with 6 notches on the N., E., and W. edges, and witnessed by a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high N. of corner.
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- From the corner of T. 45 N., R. 38 and 39 E. I run East on a blank line.
- 12.60 Intersect the closing corner of T 44 N R. 38 and 39 E.
A basalt stone 9 x 6 ins. by 8 ins. above ground, marked with 6 grooves on the S., E., and W. faces and c.c. on the S. face.
Witnessed by a mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high S. of cor.
