General northerly slope

General Description

Through R 20 E, and to the corner of secs. 32 and 33, R 21 E, this line runs across the Smoke Creek desert, a level, barren alkali desert, without vegetation, and utterly worthless for any known purpose. Its general direction is N. E. and S. W.

South of sec. 33, R 21 E the line runs across rolling foot hills, sandy, rocky and dry, unfit for cultivation.

From the corner of secs. 33 and 34 it ascend steep rocky, N. W. slope of mountains, and at 54.60 chs. reaches the N. slope, whence it proceeds along N. slope until at 63.80 chs. S. of sec. 36, it crosses the top of the mountains, and begins to descend the N. E. slope. South of sec. 34, 35 and 36, R 21 E, the line passes through some scrubby junipers, the land itself is rocky and worthless.
