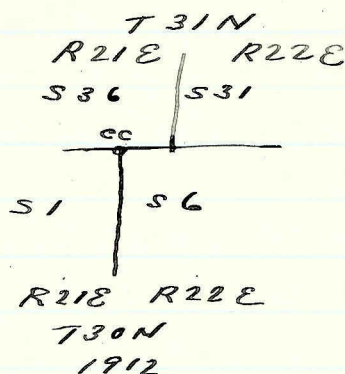


E. bdy of T30N, R21E ✓

General Description.

The W. bdy. of T29N, R21E, north of
the Pyramid Lake Indian Reservation,
is across, rocky, rolling, land; except
the extreme northern portion which
is on the Smoke creek desert. It is
practically worthless for any known
purpose.

The W. bdy. of T30N, R21E is across
the Smoke creek desert, a level, barren,
worthless tract of land, devoid of
vegetation, and so full of alkali and
other salts that nothing will grow
on it. It is worthless for any known
purpose.

The S. bdy. of T30N, R21E, runs
across the Smoke creek desert, described
above, for 22.50 chs.; thence across
rolling land for 42.50 chs., thence
over rough, steep mountains for the
balance of the way. In the mountains
there is some grass, and more or less
scattering scrubby junipers, good only
for posts and firewood. The land
