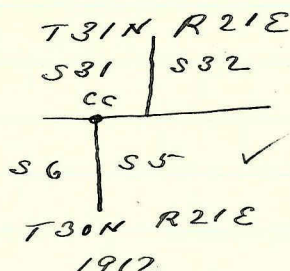

General Description

The western and north western portion of this tp is a level, barren, alkali desert, devoid of vegetation, and worthless for any known purpose. This desert is a part of the Smoke Creek desert. The eastern and southern portions are very steep, rough, high mountains, being a portion of the Fox mountains. There is considerable juniper timber in these.
