

In compliance with instructions of letter 328799 "E" W.T.P., dated June 8, 1914, from the Commissioner of the General Land Office to the Surveyor General for California, and as directed by my assignment instructions dated June 27, 1914, from A.C. Horton, Jr., Assistant Supervisor of Surveys, I proceed to mile post 169 on the California-Nevada state line in T. 19 N., R. 18 E., M.D. M., and run N. 0° 33' E. on a random line along the state boundary. At 6.89 chs. I search diligently for the closing cor. for secs. 6 and 31 on township line between Tps. 19 and 20 N., R. 18 E. Fail to find any trace of said corner.

Thence I run east on a random line along the N. bdy of sec. 6. At 31.09 chs. searched for the old cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32, but failed to find any trace of same. Continue on random line east, searching carefully for any trace of the public land cor. of the above sections. At 40.00 chs. I discontinue my random line and return to the temporary closing cor., and run west on random line along the N. bdy. of sec. 6. At 8.91 chs. I searched for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. bet. secs. 6 and 31. Found no evidence of said corner. At 63.66 chs. I find no trace of the cor. between secs. 31 and 6 on the old California-Nevada state boundary line. I continue west on a random line, and at 59.25 chs. search for the cor. of Tps. 19 and 20 N., R. 18 E. on the E. bdy. of T. 20 N., R. 17 E., but nothing is found by which I can locate the original corner.

From the temporary corner bet. secs. 31 and 6 on the old California-Nevada state boundary I search carefully south to the cor. of secs. 6, 6, 7 and 7, on the old state boundary, but fail to find any trace of the original corners.
