GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

The character of the land on both sides of the State Line from the 55 mile post to nearly the 59 mile post, is a level sagebrush flat. Most of this land, is being acquired by settlers who are clearing same and dry farming it. The principle crop is alfalfa, and other hardy grain. A goodly number of wells have been bored and nearly all of them are artesian, flowing small streams of sulphur water. The general drainage is to the NW. into Lower Alkali lake.
