80.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in diam. 6 ins. in the ground, to rock 26 ins. in a mound of stone, for 3 mile cor. bet. monuments 105 and 106, with brass cap mkd.

4.52 Mon. 106 on California-Nevada boundary, which is a pine post, $4\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, 4 ins. square, set in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, 3 ft. high, marked N on the NE. C on the SW. and 106 on the NW. face.

This monument is on a black, rocky spur, rising abruptly from Stewart Valley.

From Monument 106 on the boundary between California and Nevada, I observe that Mon. 107 bears S.46°27'E., therefore I run

S.46°27'E. on true line between Mon.106 and Mon.107.
