May 29, 1914.

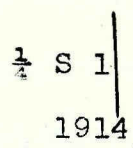
Beginning at the cor. of Tps. 41 and 42 N., Rs. 35 and 36

E., I run

South on a random line bet. secs. 1 and 6.

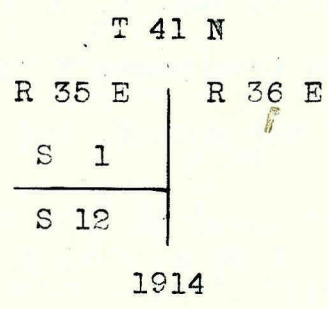
Intersect a point 27 lks. W. of the  $\frac{1}{4}$  cor. for sec. 1,  
which is an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in diam., set  
24 ins. in the ground, and marked



with pits, 18 X 18 X 12 ins., N. and S. of post, 3 ft.  
dist. and a mound of earth,  $3\frac{1}{2}$  ft. base,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high,  
W. of cor.

Intersect a point 54 lks. W. of the cor. of secs. 1 and  
12, which is an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in diam.,  
set 24 ins. in the ground, and marked



with pits, 18 X 18 X 12 ins. in each sec.,  $5\frac{1}{2}$  ft. dist.,  
and a mound of earth, 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high, W. of cor.

I find the old stake and other evidence of the old sec.  
cor. at this point, now rebuilt by Strover and Collins,  
as above described.

Course of this line is S. 0° 23' E.

June 2, 1914.

Beginning at the cor. of secs. 1 and 12, at 7h., a. m.,

1. m. t., I set off  $22^{\circ} 9'$  N. on the decl. arc, and

$41^{\circ} 28'$  N., Instrumental, on the lat. arc, and determ-  
ine a meridian with the solar;

Thence I run

South on a random line bet. secs. 7 and 12.
