

Resurvey of subdivision of fract. T. 41 N., R. 36 E.


Chains May 31, 1914.

Beginning at the cor. of secs. 3, 4, 33 and 34 on the N. bdy., at 8h., 0m., 1a.amp., 1. m. St., I set off 21° 52½' N. on the decl. arc, and 41° 29' N., Instrumental, on the lat. arc, and determine a meridian with the solar;

Thence I run

South on a random line on the east bdy. of the fraction, and noting distance and falling to the cors. along this line established by Strover and Collins, and at

475.76 Intersect the 8th. Standard Parallel^{N.} 55 lks. E. of the standard cor. of secs. 33 and 34, which is an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in diam., set 24 ins. in the ground, and marked

and pits, 18 X 18 X 12 ins. in each sec., 5½ ft. dist., and a mound of earth, 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high, N. of cor.

I find the old stake and also other evidence of the old standard cor. of secs. 33 and 34 at this point, now rebuilt by Strover and Collins, as above described.

As the cors. along the E. bdy. of the fraction, established by Strover and Collins, are not on a true line, and are irregular for distances, and as there is no evidence of any of the old cors., I destroy all trace of their line and resurvey, setting cors. at proportional distances, as follows:

N. 0° 4¼ E. on a true line bet. secs. 33 and 34.

Over level land, covered with scattering sage-brudh and greasewood.

39.66 Proportional distance, set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in diam., 24 ins. in the ground for ¼ cor. for sec. 34, with a brass cap, marked
