

14. Retracement of the Subdivision of T. 32 N., R. 57 E.

Chs.

42.30 N.89°49'W. from this $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in diam., 10 ins. in the ground to solid rock and in a mound of stone for $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. of sec. 32, only, with brass cap mkd:

$$\frac{1}{4} \frac{S 32}{1916}$$

and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, N. of cor.

55.00 Bottom of draw, 50 ft. below $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. of sec. 5, course S.60°W.; asc.

60.00 Top of low spur, projects S.60°W.; desc.

73.40 Creek of clear water, 5 lks. wide 1 ft. deep, in the bottom of draw, 60 ft. below spur, course SW. 1.00 ch., thence W.

80.41 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in diam., 24 ins. in the ground for cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31 and 32, with brass cap mkd:

T32N	R57E
S31	S32
S6	S5

$$\frac{T31N}{1916}$$

and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, W. of cor.

Land, low rolling mountainous with general drainage to the SW.

Soil, dark brown moist clay loam 2 ft. deep to hardpan. E. $\frac{1}{2}$; dark and very rocky W. $\frac{1}{2}$.

Undergrowth, scattering sagebrush E. $\frac{1}{2}$; dense tall sagebrush W. $\frac{1}{2}$.

No timber. Fair grazing. Western exposure.

Retracement of the Subdivision of T. 32 N., R. 57 E.

From the old cor. of secs. 2, 3, 10 and 11 which is a cedar post 3 ins. square, 10 ins. above ground and in a mound of stone, plainly and properly marked,

I retrace

39.91 E. bet. secs. 2 and 11.

Fall 64 lks. N. of the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. which is a piece of a decayed charred stake with marks almost invisible, and in a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 8 ins. high,

I reestablish this cor. at the same point as follows:

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in diam., 26 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap mkd:
beside old stake

$$\frac{1}{4} \frac{S 2}{S 11} \frac{1916}{1916}$$

and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, N. of cor. Therefore the true bearing of this half mile is N.89°05'W. ✓

I continue retracement on same line.

79.78 Fall 1.25 chs. N. of the old cor. of secs. 1, 2, 11 and 12 which is a piece of a decayed stake with marks almost invisible, and in a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1 ft. high.

I reestablish this cor. at the same point as follows:

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in diam., 24 ins. in the ground beside old stake for cor. of secs. 1, 2, 11 and 12, with brass cap mkd:
