



N. of cor.  
This cor. is 1000 ft. below the sec. cor.  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile east;  
in draw, course S.60°W.; ascend.

43.50 Top of spur, 5 ft. above draw, bears S.60°W.; descend  
325 ft. to the closing corner.

89.73 Intersect the W. Bdy. of the Township 163 lks. N.0°38'E.  
of the cor. of secs. 25 and 36 of T. 42 N., R. 60 E.  
At the point of intersection I build a closing corner as  
follows:

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., 24 ins.  
in the ground for C.C. of secs. 30 and 31, with brass  
cap mkd:



and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high,  
E. of cor.

Land mountainous.

Soil, gravelly and rocky dark clay loam, outcropping  
ledges of limestone.

Undergrowth, heavy sagebrush, service brush and bunch-  
grass.

Timber, mountain mahogany 13.10 chs.

Land, suitable for grazing purposes.

Nov. 20, 1914.


Nov. 21, 1914: At 8 h 10 m A.M., l.m.t., I set off 41°  
30'N. on the lat. arc; 19°45'S. on the decl. arc, and  
determine a meridian with the solar at the cor. of secs.  
29, 30, 31 and 32.

Thence I run

N.0°03'W. between secs. 29 and 30.

Over mountainous land, descend 380 ft. to the  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor.

40.00 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in  
the ground for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., with brass cap mkd:




and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high,  
W. of cor.

52.00 Bottom of draw, 190 ft. below  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., course  
S.60°W.; ascend.

62.30 Spur of ridge, 240 ft. above bottom of draw, bears  
S.60°W.; descend.

75.00 Head of draw, 5 ft. below spur, course SW.; ascend 160  
ft. to the section corner.

80.00 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., 24 ins.  
in the ground for the cor. of secs. 19, 20, 29 and 30,  
with brass cap mkd:



and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high,  
W. of cor.

Land mountainous.

Soil, coarse limestone gravel, dark loam, solid outcrops  
of limestone, some quartzite outcroppings.

Undergrowth, sage and service brush, good growth bunch  
grass, chaparral.

Timber, mountain mahogany on slopes, aspen in draws.
