

East Boundary of T. 22 N., R. 66 E.

Chains.

- June 9, 1913: North bet. secs. 1 and 6.
 Over rough rocky mountains, through dense timber.
- 4.00 Top of spur, 45 ft. above sec. cor., bears N. 80° E. and S 80° W.; descend 600 ft.
- 25.80 Dry wash, 2 lks. wide, course N. 80° E.; ascend.
- 40.00 Set a limestone 14 x 8 x 7 ins., 10 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W. face; from which a pinion pine, 6 ins. in diam., bears S. 20° E., 29 lks. dist.; marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 6 BT.
- A pinion pine, 12 ins. in diam., bears N. 70° E., 27 lks. dist.; marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. 1 BT.
- 48.50 Top of spur, 265 ft. above wash, bears N. 65° E. and S. 65° W.; descend 375 ft. to
- 61.00 Dry wash, 3 lks. wide, course N. 45° E.; ascend 225 ft. to
- 76.00 Top of spur, bears S. 70° E. and N. 70° W.; descend 30 ft. to
- 80.00 Set a limestone, 30 x 12 x 12 ins., 22 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins. in the ground, for the cor. of Tps. 22 and 23 N., Rs. 66 and 67 E., marked with 6 notches on each edge; and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, S. of cor.
- Land, rough mountainous.
 Soil, very rocky; limestone; 4th rate.
 many solid outcrops and cliffs; some grass.
 Timber, pinion pine and juniper.
 Undergrowth, desert brush.
