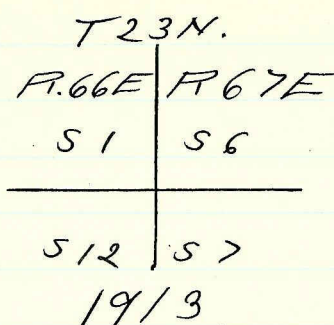


East Boundary of T.23N, R.66E.

A pine, 12 ins. in diam., bears S. 64 3/4° E,
93 lks. dist., mkd. T 23 N R 67 E S 7 BT.

A pine, 18 ins. in diam., bears S. 26° 22' W,
250 lks. dist., mkd. T 23 N R 66 E S 12 BT.

A pine, 18 ins. in diam., bears N 29° 13' W,
174 lks. dist., mkd. T 23 N R 66 E S 1 BT.

Land, rough mountainous.

Soil, very rocky; 4th rate; many
solid outcrops and cliffs; limestone;
good bit of bunch grass.

Timber, juniper, pine, and mountain
mahogany.

Undergrowth, desert brush.

Mountainous land, 80 chs.

Dense timber, 80 chs.

6.00 Bottom of draw, 60 ft. below sec.

29.00 Top of Rocky spur, 250 ft. above draw,
bears N. W. and S. E.; descend over
steep, rocky N. slope.

37.70 Descend over vertical cliffs, 100 ft. high,
bear E. and W.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in
diam., 24 ins. in the ground, for
1/4 sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.;
