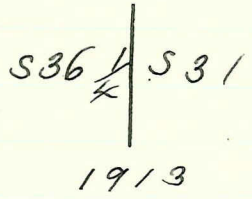
West Boundary of T. 21 N., R. 69 E.

Surveyed by J. M. Mc. Driney, Jr.
August 19, 1913: At 10^h 00^m a. m., l. m. t.,
I set off 39° 39' on the lat. arc;
12° 50' N. on the decl. arc; and
determine a true meridian with the
solar, at the ^{St.} cor. of T. 21 N., R. 68
and 69 E.

Thence I run
North, bet. secs. 31 and 36.

Over rolling ascent, through scattering
timber.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in
diam., 24 ins. in the ground, for
1/4 sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.;

in diam., 24 ins. in the ground,
for the cor. of secs. 25, 30, 31 and
36, with brass cap mkd.;
