General Description.

The surface of this township is almost entirely mountainous. The mountains are mostly low, rocky ridges; although they are quite high in the south western portion. In places, the surface is so rough and rugged as to be almost unurveyable. The soil is mostly decomposed rock, and is generally very stony and of little value. Bed rock is exposed in many places, and usually the soil is but a few inches in depth. In some of the draws, the soil is a good
