

North Boundary of T. 21 N., R. 70 E.

Chains.

A pine, 9 ins. in diam., bears N. $35\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W.,
55 lks. dist., marked T 22 N R 70 E S 33 BT.

Land, very rough mountainous.

Soil, decomposed rock; very rocky; 4th.
rate; limestone ledges, cliffs and slide
rock.

Timber, juniper, mountain mahogany
and pine.

Undergrowth, desert brush and scrub
mahogany.

Mountainous land, 80 chs.

Dense timber, 80 chs.

East, bet. secs. 3 and 34.

Over rough mountainous land, through
dense timber; descending.

14.00 Old road, bears N. and S.

14.30 Dry wash, 4 lks. wide, course S.

Thence over broken S.W. and S. slope, through
scattering timber.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in
diam., 24 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$
sec. cor., with brass cap mkd.;

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and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft.
base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high, N. of cor.

50.50 Dry wash, 3 lks. wide, course S. 20° E.;
ascend.

56.79 Intersect state line, 31.11 chs. S. $0^{\circ}32'$ E.,
of the 110th. mile post, heretofore
described.

At point of intersection, I set an
iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in diam.,
6 ins. in the ground to bed rock, and in
a mound of stone, for closing cor. of
T 21 and 22 N., R 70 E., with brass
cap mkd.;
