

Retracement of 2nd Standard Parallel North

above ground firmly set, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General bears N. 80 lks. Dist.

The course of the last $\frac{1}{2}$ mile is therefore N. 89° 17' W.

April 22, 1913. After having searched diligently for the old witness cor. of Tps. 10 N., R. 26 and 27 E. which is described by the Surveyor General as a post 20 lks. N. of a point, 18.04 Chas. W. of the cor. of Tps. 11 N., R. 26 and 27 E. I am unable to find any trace of the old cor. therefore I reestablished this cor. as follows:

From the cor. of Tps. 11 N., R. 26 and 27 E. heretofore described I run N 89° 55' W. along S. bdy. of sec. 36

18.06 Point for the closing cor. of Tps. 10 N., R. 26 and 27 E. by proportionate measurement. The cor. falls in the bed of the East Walker river. At a point 50 lks. N. I set witness cor. as follows:

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in diam., 24 ins. in the ground for witness cor. to the closing cor. of Tps. 10 N., R. 26 and 27 E. with brass cap mked:
