dig pits, 30 x 24 x 12 ins. Crosswise on each line E. and W., 4 ft.; and S of cor. 8 ft. dist. and raise a mound of earth, 5 ft. base $2\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high. S. of cor.

Resurvey of E Bdy of T. 10 N., R. 26 E.

From the point for the reestablished closing cor. I retrace south, on the east boundary of sec. 1. At 35.10 chs. I make diligent search for the old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of which I find no trace. I continue my retracement south along same line and at 76.94 Chains the old cor. of secs. 1, 6, 7 and 12 which is a ^{stone} granite ^{stone} 7 x 8 x 20 ins. above ground, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General bears E. 27 lks. dist..

From the old cor. of secs. 1, 6, 7 and 12 I run south on blank line bet. ranges 26 and 27 E. and at 38.30 Chains the old $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. of secs. 7 and 12 bears E. 37 lks. dist. I continue south on same line finding the old corner out for alignment and measurement and at 316.02 Chs. set a temporary point.

From the temporary point which I set April 22 I continue south on a blank line and at 401.26 Chains intersect E. and
