

Retracement of N. bdy. T. 14 N., R. 26 E.

Chains.

July 21, 1913: From the cor. of Tps. 14 and 15 N. R. 26 E. heretofore described in retracements, I retrace west bet. secs. 1 and 36.

The old $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. of secs. 1 and 36, which is a granite stone, 6 x 10 x 12 ins. above ground, firmly set in a mound of stone, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General, bears S. 54 lbs. Dist.

The course of this $\frac{1}{2}$ mile is therefore $5.869^{\circ} 13' W.$

I continue my retracement along same line.

The old cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36, which is a granite stone 8 x 10 x 14 ins. above ground, firmly set in a mound of stone, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General, bears S. 90 lbs. Dist.

The course of this last $\frac{1}{2}$ mile is therefore $5.89^{\circ} 29' W.$

From the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36 I retrace west bet. secs. 2 and 35.

The old $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. of secs. 2 and 35, which is a red volcanic rock, 8 x 6 x 10 ins. above ground, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General, bears S. 36 lbs. Dist.
