The old cov. of secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35, which is a granite stone,  $8 \times 6 \times 12$  ins. above ground, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General, brass 5. 39 lbs. Dist.

The course of the last  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile is therefore  $589^{\circ} 57' W.$

July 17, 1913: From the south east cor. of T. 14 N., R. 26 E. which is an iron post heretofore described, I run

West on S. body, sec. 36.

Intersect the cor. of Tps. 13, 14, R. 26 and 27 E. At this point I change bearing and run  $589^{\circ} 53' W.$  on S. body, sec. 36

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 24 ins. in the ground for  $\frac{1}{4}$  cor. of sec. 36 with brass cap mtd.;
