

Retracement of S. bdy. T. 15 N., R. 26 E.

Chains

The magnetic bearing of the true meridian at 8^h 30^m a. m. is N. 17° 15' W.; the angle thus determined gives the mag. decl. 17° 15' E.

July 27, 1913

July 26, 1913: At 8^h a. m., L. W. T. I set off 39° 6' N. on the lat. arc; 19° 30' N. on the decl. arc; and determine a meridian at the cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35, on the S. bdy. of the T^p, heretofore described. Thence I retrace

West bet. secs. 3 and 34

40.00 Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. no traces of the old $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. are found after careful search.

81.15 The old cor. of secs. 3, 4, 33 and 34, which is a post 4x4ⁱⁿ x 4 ft. long, marked with 3 notches on the east and west edges, scribed T 15 N R 26 E⁵³⁴ on the N.E. side S. 33 on the N.W. S. 4, on the S.W. side and T 14 N. R 26 E. S 3 on the S.E. side, bears S. 112 lbs. dist. The cor. is vitruered by pits and mound of earth. The cor. being greatly decayed I reestablish it at the same point as follows:

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground for cor. of secs. 3, 4, 33 and 34 with brass cap.
