79.27 The old cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34 and
35. I build a mound of stone
2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high. S. of
this cor., making it a cor.
of secs. 2 and 3, T. 14 N., R. 26 E.
Only hereafter, then I change
bearing and run
589° 12' W.
