

Subdivision of T. 18 N., R. 37 E.

Chains

Sept. 3, 1913:

At 9^h a.m., l.m.t., I set off 39° 22' N. on the lat. arc; 70° 37½' N. on the decl. arc; and determine a meridian with the solar at the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36 on the S. vdy. of the Tp.

Thence I run N 80° 1' E. bet. secs. 35 and 36 over rough mountainous land descend N.W. slope.

11.50 Descend abrupt slopes 300 ft.

21.50 Pony canyon, with running spring water, 1 lb. wide, 2 ins. deep, course N. 80° W., ascend abruptly

40.00 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 24 ins. in the ground for ¼ sec. cor. with brass cap mkd.;

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and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, W. of cor.

45.00 Enter pinion pines and mountain mahogany

55.00 Top of high, mountainous spur bears N 80° W and S. 60° E., desc. gradually along N.E. slope.

65.00 Descend abruptly through scattering pines.

80.00 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 25, 26, 35 and 36, with brass cap mkd.;
