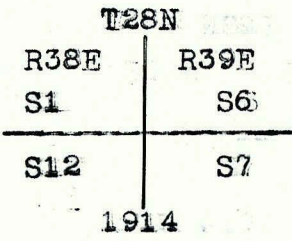


Resurvey of the west bdy. of T. 28 N. R. 39 E.

Chains.



dig pits 18 x 18 x 12 ins. in each sec., 5½ ft. dist.;  
and raise mound of earth 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high, W.  
of cor.

Land nearly level, slopes and drains west.

Soil, gravelly clay loam, 24 ins. deep.

Subsoil, gravel.

No timber.

Undergrowth, sage brush, shad scale and bunch grass.

Land suitable for farming or grazing.

18.20 Wash, 10 lks. wide, 2 ft. deep, course S. 85° W.

40.06 Proportionate measurement, set an iron post 3 ft. long,  
1 in. in dia. 26 ins. in the ground for the re-establish-  
hed ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 1 and 6, with brass cap mkd.

of cor.

44.70 Wash, 6 lks. wide, 1 ft. deep, course N. 80° W.

48.30 Creek of running water, 6 lks. wide, 2 ins. deep, course  
west.

69.70 Wash, 20 lks. wide, 10 ins. deep, course N. 80° W.

80.12 The old cor. of Tps. 28 and 29 N. 4s. 38 and 39 E.,  
previously described. Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 3 ins.  
in dia. 24 ins. in the ground by the side of the old  
cor., for the re-established cor. of Tps. 28 and 29 N.  
Rs. 38 and 39 E., with brass cap marked
