Chains.

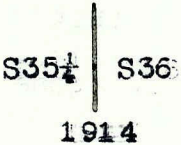
For description and tests of instruments see page 1a.

Oct. 14, 1914, at the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36 on the S. bdy. of this township I set off 40° 14½' N. on the lat. arc, and 8° 4' S. on the declination arc and at 1h 47m p.m. l.m.t. I determine a meridian with the solar. N. 0° 01' west, on true line bet. secs. 35 and 36, along east slope of mountain, through sage brush and small scattering junipers, grad. asc.

24.13 Small spring on line, drains east.

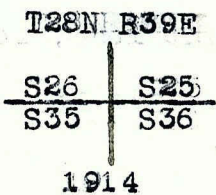
38.70 Head of canyon, 150 ft. above sec. cor., drains S. 70° E. continue asc.

40.00 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. in diam. 26 ins. in the ground for ¼ sec. cor., with brass cap marked



and raise mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high west of cor.

80.00 Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in diam. 24 ins. in the ground for the cor. of secs. 25, 26, 35 and 36, with brass cap marked



and raise mound of stone 2 ft. base 1½ ft. high west of cor.

Soil, gravely light loam, rocky in places.

Sage brush and bunch grass. Good grazing.
