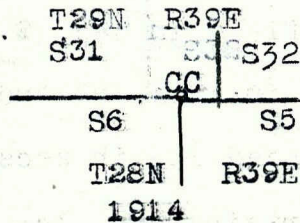


Subdivision of T. 28 N. R. 39 E.

Chains.

81.07 Intersect N. bdy. of Tp. 1.69 chs. S. $89^{\circ} 26'$ W. of the cor. of secs. 31 and 32.

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 in. in dia. 24 ins. in the ground for the closing cor. of secs. 5 and 6, with brass cap marked



and raise mound of stone 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high south of cor.

From this cor. a field belonging W. L. Pierce

SE. cor. bears S. $55^{\circ} 42'$ E.

SW. cor. bears S. $54^{\circ} 51'$ E.

NE. cor. bears S. 68° E.

NW. cor. not visible.

Soil, light sandy loam, gravel and boulders.

Shad scale, sage and rabbit brush, poor grazing.

No timber.

Drains west.

Level desert land 81.07 chs.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

This township is located near the south end of the Sonoma mountains, and averages about 7500 feet above sea level.

It is very broken and rough except in the NE. corner where the land is rolling, There is a small strip of level land along the west boundary and most of secs. 5, 6 and 7 are in the flat.

The soil in general is a clay loam and in some places limestone ledges and slide rock.

Nearly the entire township is covered with a scattering growth of junipers, it is of little value except for fuel.

There are a number of large springs in the NE. cor. of this township, the water is used for irrigation down
