Chains

Oct 31, 1913: At 8⁴⁵ m. a.m.
l.m.t., I set off 39° $43'$ N. on
the lat. arc; 14° $2'$ S. on
the decl. arc; and determine
a meridian with the solar
at the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 35 and
36 on the S. bdy. of the Tp.

Thence I run

N. 0° $1'$ W. bet. secs. 35 and 36
low mountainous land, ascend
steep slope

17.87 Crest of ridge, bears 540° W.
and $N 40^{\circ}$ E, thence along

W. slope gradually descend
39.90 Crest of ridge, 2260 ft. above
Russett river valley 6 miles west,
bears $N. 45^{\circ}$ W. and east. desc.

40.00 Set an iron post 3 ft. long,
1 in. diam., 24 ins. in the
ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. with
brass cap mtd.;
