General Description

This township is mountainous in the east, rolling in the west, and broken hilly land in the northwest portions. The soil of a narrow strip of bottom land along Boone Creek, and in a wide draw extending through sections 32, 33 and 34, is generally a deep rich, sandy clay loam, and with irrigation produces abundant crops. The soil of the rolling ridges and mountains is generally a loose gravelly clay loam, stony and rocky, which is unfit for agriculture. A good growth of grass is found throughout the township, which is part of an extensive range for cattle and horses.
