Resurvey of Ruby Valley Guide Meridian, T. 1 N.
Since the distances between some of
the corners on this bdy. are out of
the limits prescribed by the Manual,
it will be necessary to re-survey it.
so I proceed to the Standard corner
of T. 1 N., Rs. 55 and 56 E., and resurvey as
follows:

I destroy all traces of the old standard corner
of T. 1 N., Rs. 55 and 56 E., and its accessories and
re-establish it at the same point as follows:

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 3 in. diam.
24 in. in the ground for Standard corner of
Tps. 1 N and 1 S, Rs. 55 and 56 E., with
brass cap mkd.
