

General Description.

The N.W. part of sec. 12 and a strip along the creek which runs through sec. 13 is good land, with a good, fine texture, loam soil.

The rest of sec. 12 and the northern part of sec. 13 is rough, rocky, volcanic mountains. Not much good for anything. Fair growth sagebrush on them, but not much grass and they are too rough and rocky to be a very good range. The rest of sec. 13 is rolling hills and ridges, fair sagebrush and grass; a fair range country.

There is no timber, or settlers in this ^{fractional} tp. and no land in cultivation any where near.

There is a creek in sec. 13 which would furnish water for stock and would irrigate small tracts of land.
