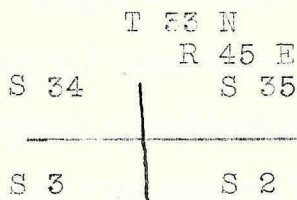

Soil; good, fine texture loam, a mixture of clay and sandy loam. 8 to 10 ft. in depth. Formed by wash in the river bottom. 1st. rate.

Big sagebrush and rye grass. No timber.
