

## Subdivision of T 33 N, R 45 E

Chains

Sept. 3, 1914.

At the cor. of secs. 1 and 2, previously described, on the N. bdy. of the tp.; at 8 h., a.m., l.m.t., I set off  $40^{\circ}45'N$  on the lat. arc,  $7^{\circ}44'N$  on the decl. arc and determine a meridian with the solar.

Thence I run

S  $0^{\circ}1'E$ , bet. secs. 1 and 2.

Along W. slope of mountain.

10.00 Edge of rim rock, bears N.E. and S.E. Desc. along W. side of mountain over slide and rim rock.

40.00 On steep, rocky W. slope; 235 ft. below rim rock.  
Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam. 24 ins. in the ground for  $\frac{1}{2}$  sec. cor. with brass cap mkd.

and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high W. of cor.

Continue along west side of mountain, over slide and rim rock, ascending slightly.

65.00 Rocky spur, sloping W. 105 ft. above  $\frac{1}{2}$  sec. cor.  
Descend slightly over S.W. slope.

80.00 65 ft. below spur  
Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 2 ins. diam. 24 ins. in the ground for cor. of secs. 1, 2, 11 and 12; with brass cap mkd.

and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high W. of cor.

Land; N. 10.00 chs. is fairly level slope on W. side near top of mountain.

S. 70.00 chs. is slide and rim rock on the W. slope of steep mountain side.

Soil; nearly all rock, loose and in place. Very little soil. 4th. rate. Practically worthless.
