

Resurvey of the S. Bdy. of T. 34 N., R. 45 E.

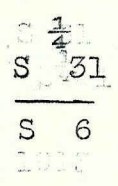
Chains, Oct. 1: I retrace eastward, from the cor. to Tps. 33 and 34 N., Rs. 44 and 45 E., along S. bdy. of secs. 31 and 32 but, after diligent search, I fail to find any evidence of old  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. or sec. cors. Therefore I return to the above Tp. cor., and resurvey E. on true line, making the distance correspond to the original notes.

E. on true line bet. secs. 6 and 31.

Over gently rolling land.

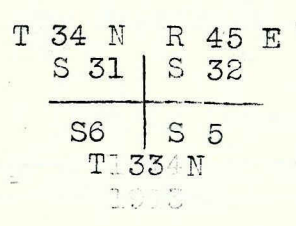
32.00 Cross barbed wire fence bearing N.89°52'E. and S.89°52'W.

38.11 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in diam., 24 ins. in the ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  cor. of secs. 6 and 31, with brass cap mkd.;



dig pits, 18x18x12 ins., E. and W. of post, 3 ft. dist.; and raise a mound of earth, 3 $\frac{1}{2}$  ft. base, 1 $\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high, N. of cor.

78.11 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. in diam., 24 ins. in the ground, for the cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31, and 32, with brass cap mkd.;



dig pits, 18x18x12 ins., in each sec. 5 $\frac{1}{2}$  ft. dist.; and raise a mound of earth, 4 ft. base, 2 ft. high, W. of cor.

Land, gently rolling.

Soil, sandy; 2nd. rate.

Undergrowth, sagebrush and short grass.

No timber.

East on a true line bet. secs. 5 and 32.

Over gently rolling land.

12.30 Dry wash, 10 lks. wide, course S.
