

Resurvey of S. bdy. T. 33 N. R. 46 E.

Chains

and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft base, 1 1/2 ft. high, S. of cor.

Thence I retrace E. on blank line from the above to cor. along the S. bdy. of Tp. between Secs. 6 & 31.

After diligent search, I find no evidence of old 1/4 sec. cor.

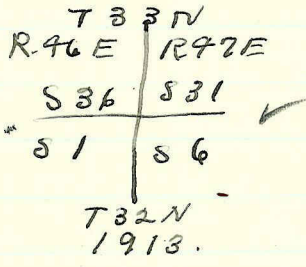
After diligent search, I find no evidence of old sec. cor.

Thence I retrace East along the S. bdy. of Tp. and after diligent search, find no evidence of any quarter, or section corners till at.

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I fall 1.28 ch. S. of cor. to Tps 32 and 33 N. Rps. 46 and 47 N. which is a broken willow stake set in ground and an 18" piece beside it, marked TXXXII with other marks undiscernible, 1/4 lb. N of the intersection of N, W & S fences. No evidence of mound or pits. I re-establish the corner at this point as follows.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long 3 ins. diam. 24 ins in ground for cor. to Tps 32 and 33 N. Rps. 46 and 47 E. with brass cap marked



and dig pits, 24 x 24 x 12 ins. on each line, N., E., and W., 4 ft., and S. of post, 8 ft. dist., and raise a mound of earth 5 ft. base, 2 1/2 ft. high S. of cor.

Thence I resurvey S. 89° 51' W. on true course setting corners at the proportionate distance
