## GENERAL DESCRIPTION.

This fractional township is rough and mountainous in the central part, dropping off to rolling lands along the fractional boundaries.

The western portion of the township drains southeast, the southern and eastern portions drain nearly east to Rock Creek and the northern portion drains northeast to Rock Creek.

There is no timber in this township but sagebrush and bunch grass grow quite abundantly. There is a small spring in Sec. 29, but otherwise no water in the township.

The ridges are mostly composed of rocky cliffs of granite and its decomposition furnishes the majority of the soil.

There is no cultivated land in the township and it is unfit for such use. There are no settlers in the township.
