General Description.

The land along this line, except for 27.60 chs. at the S. end; which is steep slide and rim rock in Rock creek canon; is robling, sagebrush covered, hills and small ravines: sloping to the S.F. on the south rly part of the line, to the east along the central part, and to the N.E. on the northerly part. The soil is a desert loam, of a fine to medium texture, has been derived from the disinte gration of volcanic rocks. Is underlaid by a firm clay subsoil. All very dry. There is a good growth of sage brush along the entire distance, but not very much grass. The herbage dries up rather early in the season. There is no timber of any kind. It is a fair grazing country, not the best; nor the worst, just fair. It is not probable that crops of any kind can be raised without irrigation
