80.00	I search diligently, but find no cor. for secs. 16,17, 20 and 21. I set temp. cor. for secs. 16,17,20 and 21.
	From the temp. cor. for secs. 16,17,20 and 21 I run N. bet. secs. 16 and 17, retracing.
40.00	I search diligently but find no $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
80.00	I search diligently but find no cor. for. secs. 8,9,16 and 17. I set temp. cor. for secs. 8,9,16 and 17
	From the temp. cor. for secs. 8,9,16 and 17 I run N. bet. secs. 8 and 9, retracing.
40.00	I search diligently but find no $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
80.00	I search diligently but find no cor. for secs.4,5,8 and 9 I set temp. cor. for secs. 4,5,8 and 9.
	From the temp. cor. for secs. 4,5,8 and 9 I run N. bet. secs. 4 and 5, retracing.
40.00	I search diligently but find no $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
80.28	I find the closing cor. of secs. 4 and 5 at N 48°30'E, 4.70 chs. dist. The closing cor. of sec. 4 and 5 is on the 7th. Standard Parallel North , at N 89°36'E, 2.78 chs. dist. from the standard $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. south of sec. 32. It is a stake 2 ins. diam. by 16 ins. above ground firmly set in a mound of earth and mkd. with 2 notches on the W. and 4 notches on the E. edge and with CC on the south. I destroy all traces of this cor. and its accessories and reestablish it at the same point as follows: Set an iron post 3 ft. long 2 ins. diam. 24 ins. in the ground for closing corner of secs. 4 and 5 with brass cap mkd.
