July 23, 1914.

At the cor. of secs. 25,30,31 and 36; on the W. bdy. of the tp., previously described.

At 8 h., a.m., l.m.t., I set off 40°52'N on the lat. arc 20°11'N. on the decl. arc and determine a true meridian with the solar.

Thence I run

E. bet. secs. 30 and 31; running a sectional correction line.

Over rough volcanic mountains, descending E. slope.

27.60 Deep ravine, 400 ft. below sec. c or., course S.

Asc. W. slope.

40.00 On high ridge, 270 ft. above ravine, bears N. and S.

Set an iron post 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam. 24 ins. in the ground for 1/2 sec. cor. with brass cap mkd.

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and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1 1/2 ft. high N. of cor.

Desc. steep E. slope.

53.60 Deep ravine, 300 ft. below ridge, course S.

Asc. W. slope

66.10 Mountain spur, 315 ft. above ravine, slopes S.W.

72.10 Ravine, course S.W. Asc. 80 ft. to

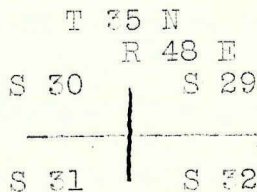
76.40 Mountain spur, slopes S.W.
