and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, $1\frac{1}{2}$ ft. high,
W. of cor.

60.90 Ridge, 1030 ft. above Mill creek, bears N.E. and S.80°W.;
descend.

65.00 Gulch, 40 lks. wide, 45 ft. below ridge, course, N.70°W.;
ascend.

79.40 Intersect the N. bdy. of Tp. 1.36 chs. E. of cor. of secs.
1,2,35, and 36 which is a limestone rock 8 x 14 x 24
ins above the ground marked and witnessed as describ-
ed by the surveyor general. I change the mound of
stone from the west to the north, making it a cor. for
secs 35 and 36. At the intersection of the lines I
build a corner as follows:

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in
the ground for closing cor. of secs. 1 and 2 with a
brass cap, mkd.
