

Fracl. subdivision of T.31 N., R.43 E.

Chains.

Vegetation, sagebrush and grease wood. No timber.

Drainage to the S.E.

June 12, 1914.

June 12: At the cor. of secs. 2,3,10, and 11, I set off 23°09'N. on the decl. arc; and, at 11h.59m.^{a.m.} l.m.t., observe the sun on the meridian; the resulting lat. is 40°34', which checks the map lat.


Thence I run

N.0°03'E., on a true line bet. secs. 2 and 3.; descend.

9.70 Draw, 15 ft. below sec. cor., course S.E.; ascend.

33.40 Ridge, 600 ft. above draw, bears S.70°E., and N.70°W.; descend.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground for 1/4 cor. of secs. 2 and 3 with a brass cap, mkd.



and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1 1/2 ft. high, W. of cor.


57.60 Gulch, 40 lks. wide, 355 ft. below ridge, course S.80°E.; ascend.

62.40 Spur, 100 ft. above gulch, slopes E.; descend.

71.60 A stream 2 lks. wide, 1 in. deep, 80 ft. below spur, course S.70°E.; ascend.

82.12 Intersect the N. bdy. of Tp. 7.46 chs. E. of the cor. of secs. 34 and 35 which is an iron post heretofore described.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in the ground for closing cor. of secs. 2 and 3 with a brass cap, mkd.



and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1 1/2 ft. high,
