


Fracl. subdivision of T.31 N., R.43 E.

Chains.

74.60 Spur, 455 ft. above stream, slopes E.: descend.

82.38 Intersect the N. bdy. of Tp., 13.43 chs. N.89°07'E. of cor. of secs. 35 and 36, heretofore described.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in ground for closing cor. of secs. 1 and 2 with a brass cap, mkd.



and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, S. of cor. This cor. is 160 ft. below spur.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, a shallow clay loam with slide rock of volcanic formation.


Vegetation, sagebrush and greasewood. No timber.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 26 ins. in the ground for ¼ cor. of sec. 1, with brass cap, mkd.



and raise a mound of stone 2 ft. base, 1½ ft. high, E. of cor.

42.38 The ¼ cor. of secs. 1 and 2 heretofore described. I obliterate the markings on this cor. referring to sec. 1, thus making it a cor. of sec. 2 only.
