

Resurvey of N. bdy. of T.32 N., R.43 E.

Chains

Thence I run

S.88°00'W., on a true line along the south bdy. of
sec. 31.; descend.

- 5.00 Small draw, 115 ft. below sec. cor., course N.W.;
ascend.
- 9.00 Low spur, 13 ft. above draw, slopes north, descend.
- 15.00 A small draw, 81 ft. below spur, course N. W.; ascend.
- 29.50 Ridge, 18 ft. above draw, bears N.W. and S.E.; descend.
- 40.30 Intersect the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 31 which is a quartz
rock heretofore described. This cor. is 107 ft.
below ridge. From this cor. the N.E. ^{cor.} of F.L. Marker's
fence, bears S.20°W., about 10 chs. dist.

Thence I continue

N.89°57'W., on a true line along the S. bdy. of sec.
31.; descend.

- 60.80 Trout creek, 10 lks. wide, 14 ins. deep, 126 ft. be-
low $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., course N.10°W.; ascend.
- 60.95 Wagon road, bears, N.10°W. and S.10°E.
From this point, the N.W. cor. of F.L. Marker's fence
bears S.10°W., about 12.00 chs. dist.
- 74.30 A low ridge, 311 ft. above Trout creek, bears, N.W. and
S.E.; descend.
- 79.37 Intersect the N.W. twp. cor. of T.32 N. R.43 E., which
is a granite rock heretofore described.
This cor. is 85 ft. below low ridge.
A rancher, F.L. Marker has fenced about 160 acres, and
does a little farming along Trout creek.
Land, is low hills, partly rocky.
Soil, is a light sandy loam about 6 ins. deep with a
sandy and gravelly subsoil mixed with rocks of
granite formation.
Vegetation, a heavy growth of sagebrush and good bunch
grass, scattering willows along Trout creek. No
timber.
