

Subdivision of T.32 N., R.43 E.

Chains

50.00 Draw, 41 ft. below spur, course S.W.; ascend through slide rock.

71.35 High ridge, 696 ft. above draw, bears N. and S.; descend

80.10 The cor. of secs. 3,4,9, and 10. This cor. is 243 ft. below ridge.

Land, rough and mountainous.

Soil, a clay loam mixed with large rocks of volcanic formation. Vegetation sagebrush and bunch grass. No timber.


Drainage southerly.

May 21, 1914.

Thence I run

N.0°05'W., on a true line bet. secs. 3 and 4 to a closing corner.; ascend a rough rocky slope.

40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. in dia., 1 8 ins. in the ground to solid rock in a mound of stone for 1/4 cor. of secs. 3 and 4 with a brass cap, mkd



and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1 1/2 ft. high, W. of cor.

44.65 Top of ridge, 606 ft. above sec. cor., bears S.80°W., and S.40°E.; descend.

82.00 Draw, 1096 ft. below ridge, course N.E.; ascend.

85.10 Intersect the N. bdy. of Tp. 1.63 chs. S.89°55'E. of cor. of secs. 33 and 34, which is a large granite boulder heretofore described.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., 12 ins. in the ground to solid rock in a mound of stone for closing cor. of secs. 3 and 4, with a brass cap, mkd
