


Subdivision of T.32 N., R.43 E.

Chains

and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high,  
W. of cor.

- 42.00 Low spur, 20 ft. above creek, slopes E.; descend.
- 45.60 Gulch, 30 lks. wide, 17 ft. below spur, course S.50°E.;  
ascend.
- 67.50 Spur, 147 ft. above gulch, slopes N.80°E.; descend.
- 80.00 Wash 50 lks. wide, 211 ft. below spur, course E.; ascend.
- 88.97 Intersect the N. bdy. of Tp. 85 lks. N.89°47'E. of cor.  
of secs. 35 and 36 which is an iron post heretofore  
described.

Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 2 ins. in dia., 24 ins. in  
the ground for closing corner of secs. 1 and 2 with a  
brass cap, mkd



and raise a mound of stone, 2 ft. base,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  ft. high,  
S. of cor. This cor. is 15 ft. above wash.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, a light clay loam with a rocky and gravelly sub-  
soil. Vegetation sagebrush and bunch grass. No timber.

Drainage to the N.E.

May 30, 1914.

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At 3h.00m.a.m., l.m.t., I observe Polaris at eastern  
elongation, in accordance with Manual of Instructions  
and mark a point in the line thus determined, on a peg  
driven in the ground, 5 chs. N. of my station, which  
is in camp, near the center of sec. 35.

May 31, 1914.

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May 31: At 7h.a.m., l.m.t., I lay off the azimuth of Pol-  
aris, 1°31' to the west, and mark the meridian thus de-  
termined, by a point on a peg firmly set in the  
ground.
